Regarding snow days; they are not days off (except for the Senior Class). We add days to the end of the year calendar. Snow days do present challenges as things like MCAS, AP exams, ACCESS rarely change their dates so we're still responsible for the work, just in a shorter amount of time. Students should be encouraged to take some reading home or to do work on anything that will keep them current in your class.

We could be home one or two days and then we have Friday as a PD Day. That's a lot of down time for students, especially after last week's schedule. Maybe next year at this time we'll follow some other districts and have Chromebook/Google days and not snow days??

As of tonight Monday, January 26th at 6:00PM the City of Malden will declare a snow emergency. We encourage residents to find off-street parking as soon as possible. After the snow emergency begins at 6PM tonight, winter parking restrictions will be strictly enforced.

To avoid being ticketed or towed, you must seek off-street parking. There will be 7 locations for residents to park free of charge from 6:00PM tonight until the snow emergency is lifted. These locations are the Early Learning Center, Beebe, Forestdale, Ferryway, Linden and Salemwood Schools and downtown at the CBD Garage located at 170 Centre St.

## **WHAT IS PARCC AND WHO'S TAKING IT?**

PARCC stands for the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers.

The state Board of Elementary and Secondary Education will decide in fall 2015 whether or not to adopt PARCC assessments for Massachusetts.

Even if the Board adopts PARCC, the 10th grade MCAS will remain a graduation requirement through the class of 2019 (current 8<sup>th</sup> graders), MCAS-Alt will continue as is for all grades, and the MCAS science tests will continue in the applicable grades.

This school year our 9<sup>th</sup> graders will take the "PARCC" as part of the two year <u>practice</u> cycle.

The 9<sup>th</sup> graders will also take the MCAS Science as part of their graduation requirement.
