News from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education

Governor Patrick Calls for Major New Investment in Education:

This week, Governor Patrick announced a new \$550 million education investment package for FY14 that increases to nearly \$1 billion annually over the next four years to ensure that all students across the Commonwealth are prepared to succeed. The Governor's proposal for K-12 includes a \$70 million targeted expanded learning time initiative for middle school students in high-need schools, \$20 million in new funding for supports to students and families in Gateway Cities, and a roughly \$226 million FY14 increase in Chapter 70 aid to keep all districts at foundation levels of spending and complete the Chapter 70 equity reforms of 2007. Cohort Graduation Rate and Annual Dropout Rate Reports – Coming Next Week:

ESE will provide school and district leaders with access to final 2012 cohort graduation rate and annual dropout rate data beginning on Tuesday on the [Security Portal](#). We anticipate releasing the data publicly next Thursday, Jan. 24. As a reminder, the cohort graduation rate and annual dropout rate data are strictly embargoed until the ESE public release. Chapter 70 and Required Local Contributions Calculations – Coming Next Week:

The [Chapter 70](#) state aid and required local contribution calculations for each municipality and district will be posted on ESE's school finance webpage at

<http://finance1.doe.mass.edu/> next Wednesday, Jan. 23, following the release of the Governor's House 1 budget proposal. As always, districts are advised to construct their local budgets with sufficient flexibility to accommodate the changes that typically occur in the state budget process.

New Background Checks Bill:

Following up on last week's note about the new national background check law that was recently signed by Governor Patrick, ESE does not yet have any details to share on how this process will work. We will keep you posted as the system is developed by the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security. We know that many districts will recruit for the next school year over the upcoming months. We advise districts to notify applicants of this upcoming requirement and to make any job offers contingent upon the results of the background check.

Four Model Curriculum Units – Now Available:

As part of our Race to the Top initiative, teams of MA educators are developing more than 100 pre-K to 12 model curriculum units in English language arts and literacy, history/social science, mathematics, and science and technology/engineering. These units are aligned to the 2011 MA Curriculum Frameworks in English Language Arts and Literacy and Mathematics, which incorporate the Common Core State Standards. ESE has released the following four units, located at <http://www.doe.mass.edu/candi/commoncore/>, as prototypes for districts to use: Grade 3 ELA/Literacy: Whose Story Is It? The Craft and Structure of Writing about History (Topic – Plymouth); Grade 6 Mathematics: Ratios and Rates; Grade 8-10 History/Social Science: US Constitutional Rights; and Grades 9-12 Science and Technology/Engineering: Energy-Physics.

New MA Teaching and Learning Platform – Coming Soon:

As part of Race to the Top, ESE is developing an integrated suite of cutting-edge tools and resources to promote best practices in classroom instruction and assessment. ESE will soon launch Edwin, a new, comprehensive teaching and learning platform that will provide every public school educator in Massachusetts with a single entry point to access resources in teaching, learning, and analytics. Edwin will provide on-demand access to instructional resources, curriculum planning tools, model curriculum units, and a variety of assessments including curriculum embedded performance assessments.

[Edwin Analytics](#) will provide authorized districts with access to new information, reports, and perspectives on education and programs that specifically support improvements in teaching and learning. Edwin Analytics will integrate longitudinal data from pre-kindergarten through public post-secondary education to help inform decision making about how and where educators can improve their teaching practices to provide an exceptional learning experience to students. The Edwin Analytics tools will include the

Massachusetts [Early Warning Indicator System](#) (EWIS), college and career readiness reports, and the [Education Data Warehouse](#). Edwin Analytics will go live for all districts and schools beginning in January 2013.

[Edwin Teaching & Learning](#) will provide online tools for educators to create standards-based curriculum maps, curriculum units and lesson plans, and the ability to build and deliver interim and formative assessments. Educators will also be able to access an array of digital materials and resources to aid in classroom instruction. All of the materials in Edwin Teaching & Learning will be aligned to the 2011 MA Curriculum Frameworks in [English Language Arts and Literacy](#) and [Mathematics](#), which incorporate the Common Core State Standards.

To support Edwin Teaching & Learning, Massachusetts is jointly procuring an instructional improvement system (IIS) with Ohio. Through a competitive bid process, a vendor will soon be announced that will provide the ISS for both states. Edwin Teaching & Learning will be available to a few pilot districts beginning in January 2013, and to all Race to the Top districts beginning in the 2013-14 school year.

Malden Reads is gearing up for a wide slate of community events in coming months—and residents are invited to get on board by picking up a copy of this year's book, "The Absolutely True Diary of Part Time Indian" by Sherman Alexie.

The book tells the story of a teen from the Spokane Indian Reservation, who transfers to a nearby all-white school in search of a better life. Told with wit and engaging artwork, it's a coming-of-age story about resilience, fitting-in and staying true to one's roots.

Many copies of the book are available for loan at the Malden Public Library. Discounted copies are also available for \$12 at [Malden Access TV](#) and at [Bestseller's Café](#) in Medford, an independent bookstore and a local supporter of Malden Reads. Malden Reads will also distribute free copies of the book at various locations across the community in coming weeks for people to read and pass on to others. Companion books for younger readers are available at the library for loan and on sale at the Bestseller's Café. Of course, you can also order from your favorite online retailer to obtain copies of the main book or companion selections.

Malden Reads is a grassroots program that's about building community and promoting literacy and a love of reading. The central idea is inviting everybody to read the same book and then share in community events and activities.

Malden Reads will host an Opening Celebration at the Malden Public Library on Thursday, Feb 21, from 6:30 - 8:30pm. We hope you can join us for this gala event in the historic section of the library. Stay tuned for more details, but please mark your calendars! And, while final details are still coming together, book discussions, guest speakers, community meals and a movie series are all slated for coming months.
