Principal's Note

What a crazy few days it has been. I was in New York City for part of the weekend, and spent my Saturday night glued to a TV until past 1am watching the protests at JFK Airport. Hearing the stories of families separated by global politics my thoughts immediately turned to our own students at Malden High School. A number of our students come from the list of now banned countries. Beyond the obvious hardship for those families immediately impacted (and others left to surmise if their homeland is next), the thing that struck me the most was the confusion around the orders and stays that came out of various district courts. The federal employees at airports weren't sure what to make of the court rulings, so I can only imagine how confusing these last few days have been for our immigrant students and their families.

I ask you in this public forum, no matter what your beliefs or political leanings, to reach out to those who are scared, confused, or upset by the travel ban. As a school, we are better equipped than any other entity in our students' lives to work with them and educate them on what is happening in the world. It is easy to shy away, easy to continue on as normal, but this level of unrest is far from normal. It is imperative that the vulnerable in our community know that they are a part of our family and that we will treat them as such.

Please feel free to lean on guidance counselors, adjustment counselors, house principals, and teachers and other staff who are comfortable working with students through such things for help. Most importantly, remember that patience and kindness know no political identity. Let's listen to

each other and care for each other.
