On Sunday October 15, four Malden High Students, Tihun Lawrence, Hajar El Khalfaoui, Sherley Maximin, and Taylor Winters, attended the Terezin Music Foundation Gala, "Do Not Forget Me," along with MHS parent Susan Lawrence. The students were specially invited by Facing History and Ourselves to attend the gala, and had the chance to re-connect with Holocaust Survivor Dr. Anna Ornstein, who they had met at the Holocaust Memorial on September 13. The students have begun to correspond with Dr. Ornstein and will continue to work with her, and Facing History, to continue to take a stand against hatred and bigotry. Terezín Music Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving the musical legacy of the composers held in the Terezin concentration camp in what is now the Czech Republic.
