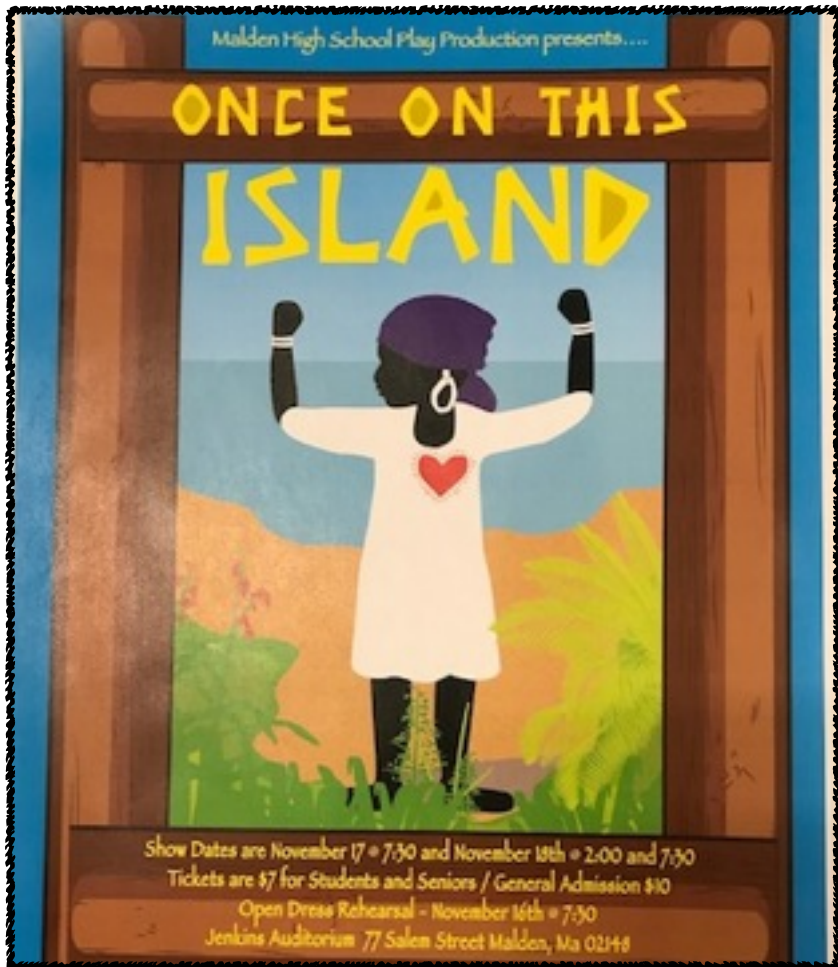


'WE LOVE IT!!' Friends talk old times in alum's visit to his alma mater

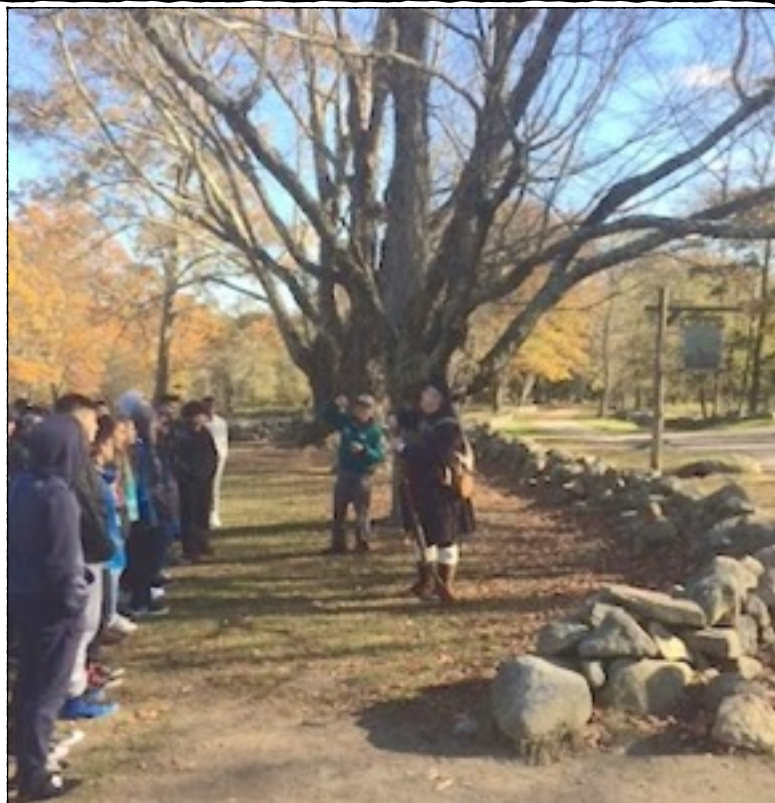
