Food for thought:

Phil Daro: "If I had to look at one thing to judge the implementation of the standards in a school, I would look at the cognitive demand of assignments across classrooms. In a lot of ways, that's the critical thing. What's presented to the

students is not as important as what students are responsible for doing. Put another way, what the students make is more important than what's made for the students. So, giving teachers examples of student work that exemplify the kind of thing that they should be working on is essential. It is no less important to ask whether the materials given to teachers support the kind of student assignments that are likely to produce the kind of student work that exemplifies the standards. I see very little of this now."
