Audio/visual equipment will be installed at the Holden Street Entrance and at the Main Entrance on Salem Street (under the blue overhang). Monitors and buzzers will be installed in the Main Office and when completed people will need to be buzzed in after school starts in the morning. We will announce the date of this new system many times before we begin the implementation. Consultants are also working to tie the key card access system into the network. Soon staff will be able to use the swipe cards to enter the building. Finally, the cameras are up and running and training will be held for the administrative team when we return from vacation. We have already used the cameras to solve several issues recently. I am not sure we can do much more.



# **★** Four Types of Educator Plans

# 1. Developing Educator Plan

For educators without Professional Teaching status, administrators in the first three years in a district, or at the discretion of an evaluation for an educator in a new assignment

# 2. Self-Directed Growth Plan

For experienced educators rated Proficient or Exemplary on their last evaluation; these plans can be one or two years in length......This is every PTS teacher at Malden High School as of 2012-2013

## 3. Directed Growth Plan

For educators rated Needs Improvement on their last evaluation

# 4. Improvement Plan

For educators rated Unsatisfactory on their last evaluation

# Three categories of evidence must be collected for each educator:

- 1. Multiple measures of student learning, growth, and achievement
- 2. Judgments based on observations and artifacts of professional practice
- 3. Additional evidence relevant to standards
  - This includes evidence collected by the educator and shared with the evaluator relating to fulfilling Standard III: Family and Community Engagement and Standard IV: Professional Culture from the Model System Teacher Rubric

# News from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education

Adams Scholarship: In early January, some superintendents will receive additional John and Abigail Adams Scholarship letters for students in the class of 2013 who did not previously receive a letter. Superintendents should distribute any letters they receive to the appropriate principal(s) in their district. ESE has also updated the Adams Scholarship guidelines online to reflect that the scores for a 9th grader who takes a Science and Technology/Engineering (STE) test in 2013 will count toward his or her scholarship eligibility. #### ESE's Core Work - New Video and Reference Guide:

As part of an ongoing effort to improve communications with school and district leaders, ESE has developed a short video and companion reference guide to provide a big picture overview of the agency's work and initiatives. These new tools convey the four primary strategies we are implementing in classrooms, schools, and school districts across the state. In September, Commissioner Chester visited two schools, Arthur W. Coolidge Middle School in Reading and South High Community School in Worcester. During those visits, a WGBH film crew accompanied the commissioner to capture footage of his conversations with educators, as well as interviews with the commissioner, school and district leaders, teachers, and students.

We encourage you to watch the video, which is a compilation of the two visits, and use it to facilitate conversations with educators, students, parents, and other community members about how the strategies align with local reform efforts.
