Instead of trying to supply easy answers to complicated questions, the ensemble holds up a mirror, transporting the audience to an intimate place in the lives of soldiers and their families that few of us outside that world ever get to see. The cast portrays these worlds with fearless honesty, allowing the audience to create their own understandings of events. "
