The Chromebook Initiative is up and running. Here are some updates on this week's happenings:

1) Teachers have Chromebooks! This is huge!

2) Students from Paul Marques' computer club have begun training for Chromebook repair and troubleshooting.

3) Help Desk kids were at work in classrooms helping teachers and students with log-ins and setting up Google Classroom.; Great success in Todd Cole's Mixed Chorus class as students have begun utilizing Google Forms/Classroom to schedule rehearsal availability, take quizzes on key signatures and to critique videos.

4) The 1:1 committee met on Thursday and began planning the roll-out for 2015-2016. We are the process of scheduling visits to grade 8 staff and students.

5) A sub-committee met to begin revisions of the AUP

6) Tech Tuesdays are up and running. Come by for Google Chromebook help every Tuesday after school in J264.

7) PARCC pilot was successful with students utilizing Chromebooks. PARCC testing begins Monday.

8) A limited Pathways Chromebook pilot begins next week

9) Gmail and outlook are being synced. We will let you know shortly when gmail is fully functional.

10) Teacher Leaders have been working with teachers of mixed classes to provide log-ins and devices for the students to help make technology accessible for all in the last quarter.

11) There is great work being done in the classrooms as students have begun to produce online notes, teachers have shared documents and resources, and students have completed at home online quizzes for STEM classes.

12) Loaners have been enrolled and should be ready this week. This is a limited program for freshmen who need devices due to loss, theft, repair, etc.

Special thanks to the senior interns in the tech office for helping with this. 13) Talks have begun about further PD for teachers of all subject areas. We encourage and welcome your feedback. Please continue to fill out surveys, shoot us emails, and speak to us about desired Professional Development.

Thank you for your continued support of this program. Needless to say, this has been a hectic last couple of weeks. Natalia and I do ask for your patience as we work to manage this initiative with our classroom schedules and school-wide duties. Please utilize the Help Desk as needed, and continue to email us or contact us and we will respond as soon as possible.
