### Final Exam Policies

Just to clarify as we approach the end of the year, here are a couple of key policies on final exams:

For seniors, if they have an average of 85 or above for the year, they are exempt from that final and receive that year average as their final grade.

For all students, there are no early exams. Students who miss an exam or exams and makeup sessions for reasons approved by their house principal can take that exam when they return, even if it is after school is out. The student's house principal will work with them to schedule a time during summer session. Again, this is ONLY for specific situations approved by the student's house principal.
