Are you normally a teacher with a Directed Study duty? Would you like to do something interesting in your Directed Study 1-2 times per week next year? Are you interested in learning more about <u>circle discussions</u> to build community and address issues?

Communities for Restorative Justice, a nonprofit that has been working in Malden High School for a year, will be offering training for 6-8 faculty members interested in becoming <u>circle keepers</u>. Circles are one part of restorative practices. *The circle provides an opportunity for individuals to hear one another, share stories, resolve differences, and improve relationships. It is a seemingly simple process that uses a talking piece to slow down conversations and give everyone space to speak. It has been used successfully in schools around the globe.* Restorative practices are being used in many schools around the country:

to address discipline in non-punitive ways and to help students learn how to communicate better with each other (and adults)

After being trained the staff would run "circles" one to two days per week per semester as part of their Directed Studies.

Please join us on Wednesday, June 3rd from 2:30-3:15 pm in the high school library to learn more about this exciting opportunity.
