Good morning,

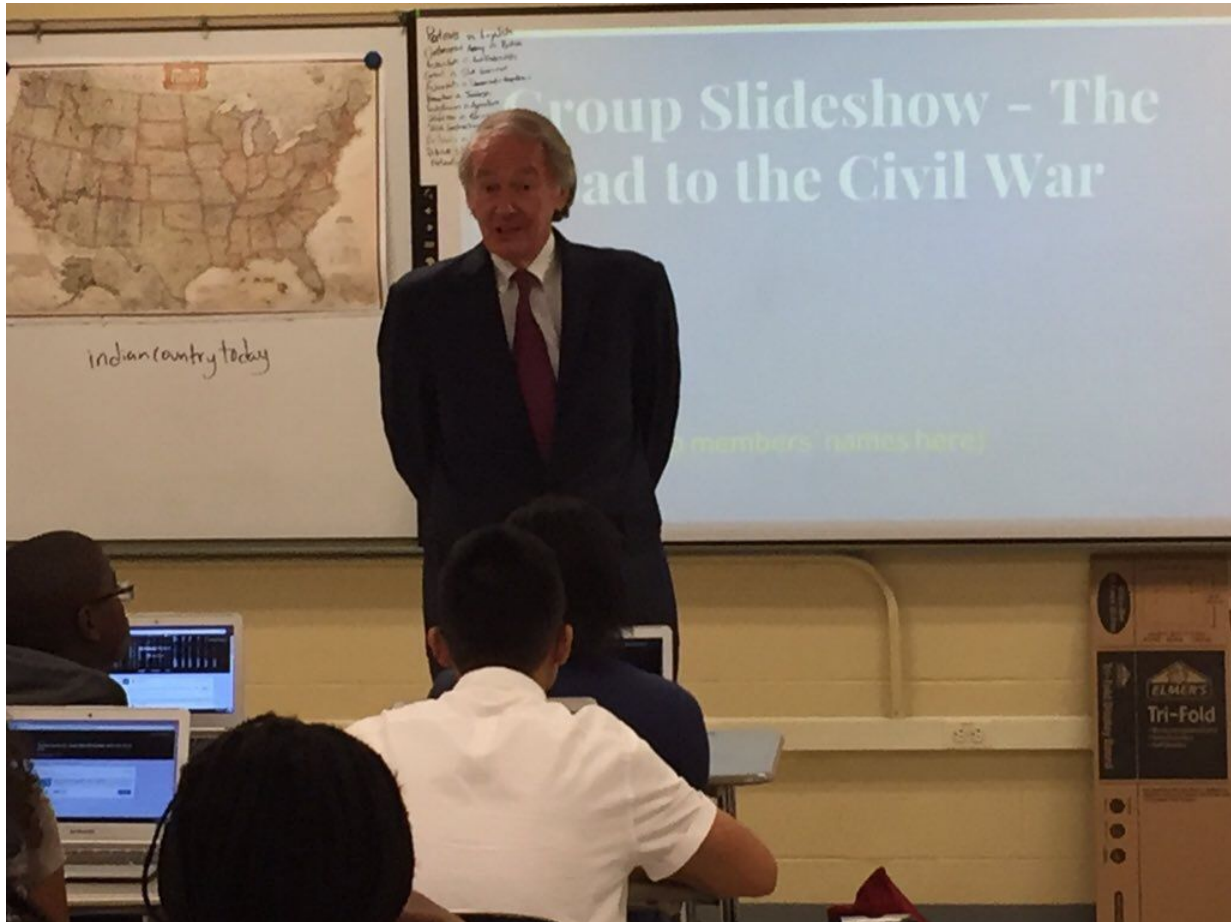
