Recently, Angela Duckworth, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Psychology was asked to do a presentation at Belmont Day School. She is currently working at the University of Pennsylvania and is doing groundbreaking research at the university on a trait she has labeled *grit* and how it plays a role in success. Grit, Dr. Duckworth says, is what separates simply smart students from those who can excel. "Grit is choosing to show up again and again," says Duckworth. "You're going to have to stick to it when it's hard. Grit may be as essential as talent to high accomplishment."

- 3. Feedback, by email, regarding your resolved problem.



5 Step Evaluation Cycle



Begin with the self-assessment:

The process includes:


- Personal reflection
- Looking at survey data
- Looking at student data
- Looking at student work
- A review of previous evaluations
- Meeting with colleagues and having difficult conversations
- Using student data from previous surveys used in your classroom

Here are the elements of the self-assessment:

- 1. An analysis of evidence of student-learning, growth, and achievement for students under your responsibility.
- 2. An assessment of practice against each of the four Performance Standards of effective practice using the district's rubric.

- 3. Proposed goals to pursue:
 - At least one goal directly related to improving your own professional practice.
 - At least one goal directly related to improving student learning.
