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Looking ahead to Get AHEAD day, Wednesday, October 16, 2013

On Wednesday, October 16th the rotation is 3, 4, and 2. We have a full and robust slate of activities scheduled for that day:

- 1. It is a national testing day for the PSAT and we provide all of our sophomores and juniors the PSAT at no cost. Sophomore and junior students take the test in their homerooms. Ron Janowicz and Manjula Karamcheti can answer any questions you may have. Juniors taking the test can qualify for several national scholarships including the National Merit Scholarship. PSAT results are also used as a predictor of success in Advanced Placement courses.
- 2. The seniors participate in a college and career day with dozens of colleges, universities, and post graduate programs scheduled to participate. The event is held in both cafeterias.
- 3. Our freshmen participate in college/university visits. The goal of the visit is to introduce our freshmen to a college or university and to generate questions and interests regarding their future plan.

All staff members are involved in some way in carrying out the activities of the day.
