The Office of Tiered System of Support (OTSS) is pleased to announce that the application for the Fall 2014 Massachusetts FOCUS Academy (MFA) is now open. The MFA offers cost-free, on-line or hybrid, graduate courses in a variety of topics that provide educators and related service providers the skills, knowledge and strategies to meet the needs of all students, including those with disabilities, in safe and supportive, inclusive education environments. It is intended to address the DESE's goals to have qualified educators in every public school classroom, to improve student outcomes, and to reduce achievement gaps. Participants in the courses receive 67.5 PDPs upon course completion and also have the option to purchase three (3), graduate level credits at a discounted rate through the

partnering Institution of Higher Education (IHE), with which the course instructors are affiliated.
