
MALDEN HIGH SCHOOL VISION STATEMENT

Holocaust Survivor Israel Arbeiter addresses members of the MHS Class of 2018

Lived through Nazi concentration camp horrors

Israel Arbeiter, a 92-year-old Holocaust survivor, made a rare public appearance Tuesday where he addressed over 400 Malden High School seniors in the Jenkins Auditorium and painted a riveting portrait of tragedy and survival at the hands of the Nazis. Mr. Arbeiter, who was accompanied by Mayor Gary Christenson was greeted by Supt. John Oteri and MHS principal Ted Lombardi along with Social Studies Team Leader Mr. Hurley. You could hear a pin drop during Mr. Arbeiter's harrowing tale of survival of the horrors of enslavement and life in the 1940s Nazi concentration camps in Poland, his home country. Over 6 million Jews were killed in the Holocaust. Mr. Arbeiter had befriended MHS students who met him in August at the Holocaust Memorial at a visit after a Malden student vandalized the Memorial in Boston.


