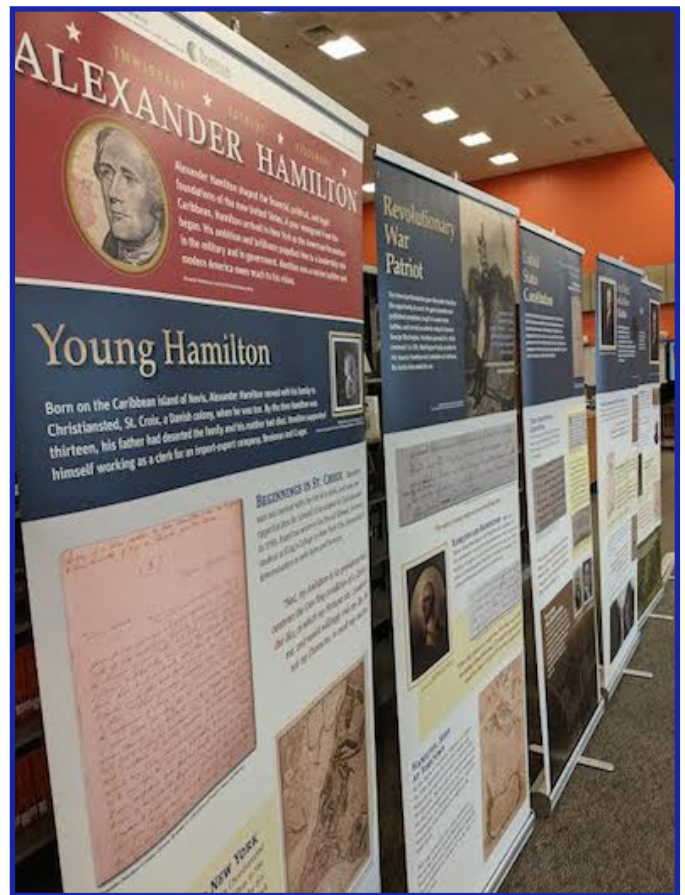


Educating English Language Learners
