




MALDEN HIGH SCHOOL VISION STATEMENT



Malden High senior swim captain Pete Jinapin spent a lot of time in his Golden Tornado pool dominance setting school records in individual events... and then re-breaking them in other water histrionics. In his final swim as a Tornado, Jinapin did not disappoint! The Malden star broke his own school record in the 100 breaststroke with a 1:00.24 finish and SECOND PLACE in the STATE at the MIAA Division 1 State Championship Meet. Jinapin ALSO set the school record in the 200 Individual Medley with a time of 1:58.29, finishing SEVENTH in the state. Jinapin also swam a leg in the 200 medley with Lombardi, Wang and Ochoa for a SEVENTH PLACE finish in the state in that event. What a season for The JINAPIN DYNASTY in 2017-2018!!
