
MALDEN HIGH SCHOOL VISION STATEMENT

HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR SPEAKS AT MALDEN HIGH SCHOOL: Holocaust survivor George Elbaum came to Malden High School and spoke to over 200 students in the Jenkins Auditorium about his early life in occupied Poland during World War II. Mr. Elbaum's story resonated with our students as his formative years were spent under the harsh and brutal conditions imposed on the Jewish people of Poland the Warsaw region during World War II. Elbaum described the deplorable living conditions in the Warsaw Ghetto and then episodes in his life when he escaped the ghetto and was harbored by various non-Jewish families until he was reunited with his mother at the end of the war and then emigrated to the U.S. where he attended high school in Alabama

This five-day residential program was held recently and was facilitated and directed by the MIAA staff and featured national trainers Kevin Ringhofer, Marty Harding and Deb Hult. Throughout the week, leadership trainees learned practical strategies for working with coaches, students and parents to promote the five "pillars" of MIAA Educational Athletics wellness, sportsmanship, leadership, coaches' education and community service. Topics for the course included training coaches and school activity staff members, conducting preseason meetings, enforcing rules and codes for effective prevention, workshops for student activity participants and adult leaders, responding to student problems, dating abuse and safe dating, heroin and prescription painkillers and social emotional learning. Expenses for this week-long workshop were paid for by the MIAA, including training, educational materials, hotel accommodations and meals. Workshop participants attended sessions at the MIAA Office in Franklin, MA and the Holiday Inn Express in Milford, MA. The 2018 graduates join an alumni base of over 700 participants who have participated in this program.


ADVANCED PLACEMENT RESEARCH PROJECT PRESENTATIONS THURSDAY IN MHS LIBRARY

I wanted to share details about a couple of events that are tied in with our work with Facing History and Ourselves and Holocaust Remembrance based on the work that began with our visit to the Holocaust Memorial last September.

On April 11, I had the honor and privilege to attend Yom Hashoah Service (Holocaust Remembrance) with several Malden High Students. The students spoke at the end of the service to the Jewish Community of Temple Shalom in Medford and spoke about why it is important for them to continue to remember the victims of the Holocaust. It was a moving and powerful service in remembrance of the victims of the Shoah and to honor survivors. The students read their own prepared remarks with Netta reading a stirring statement written by her mother, Fern Remedi-Brown, who is the daughter of survivor Dr. Alan Brown. My apologies for not having any pictures to share, but the nature of the event - being a religious service - made for the taking of pictures inappropriate. However the students were truly amazing and showed this community that they are committed to the concept of Never Again.

Last week Malden High School hosted Mr. George Elbaum in the Jenkins Auditorium from 12:50-2:15. Mr. Elbaum's story of survival as a Jewish boy living in Nazi occupied Poland is one that resonated with our students. I always find that meeting with Holocaust survivors and hearing their story helps me re-focus my life on what is most important and not allow the little things in my world which so often overwhelm me to consume me. Thank you as always, for your support of students and staff in all of this.
