'A World of Difference' comes to Malden High

Students from sophomore & junior classes will be trained as peer leaders

A World of Difference is a program organized by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL). The club is run by freshman guidance counselor, Taryn Belowsky, Social Science teacher Gregory Hurley, and Principal Chris Mastrangelo.

The Anti-Defamation League is a non-governmental organization that "fights anti-Semitism and all forms of bigotry, defends democratic ideals, and protects civil rights for all." Founded in 1913 by B'nai B'rith and Sigmund Livingston, their goal was to create a safe place for people of different religion, race, or gender to live the American dream.

The club is accepting 30 students from the sophomore and junior classes as peer leaders to mentor freshman. Belowsky stated that "the peer leaders will go through intensive training on social justice, anti-bias, combating racism and discrimination." The training will last three days and then the leaders

They were engaged with our students and never lost focus on the enormous responsibility of caring for 187 high school students in the heart of downtown Boston.

MHS students grateful for opportunity to take in Hamilton performance & educational sessions

A group of 187 Malden High School students, accompanied by MHS Principal Mastrangelo and 20 staff member/chaperones this past Thursday got the thrill of attending a matinee showing of *Hamilton*, the acclaimed Broadway blockbuster musical which has been packing theaters since the summer of 2015.


This fall Hamilton began a nationwide tour, starting with performances in Boston at the Boston Opera House and continuing onto 13 other cities and states. In concert with the actual theater performance, the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History's Hamilton Education Program is giving Title 1 high schools an opportunity to see the award-winning Broadway musical at a nominal cost. On Thursday, October 18, 180 Malden High School students and 20 staff filled five buses to Boston and took part in the full-day Hamilton Education Program. While tickets for the show are \$199.00 face value and are often re-sold for four or five times that amount.. or more, MHS students joined

2,500 others from across state and paid only \$10,00 due to support from the show's producers, the Rockefeller Foundations, the Lynch Foundation, Broadway in Boston and the John Gore Organization.

In a *Blue & Gold* story, History teacher Michelle Filer said that the department received the news that they would be attending the show in May or April of the 2017-2018 school year. Filer stated that "it was really through Damian Aufiero (a former MHS history teacher that we had this opportunity." She also said when Aufiero left, he left the role of leadership and planning to her, although it has been a collaborative effort.
