ZOMBIE TAG captures spirit of Halloween once again @ Malden High

The Halloween festivities began early this year, as the Malden High School Fine Arts Club hosted their annual Zombie Tag event on October 23.

President of Fine Arts Club, My Hua stated that her "favorite part of Zombie Tag [was] sitting in the main office watching students run from [the] zombies." She explains that her and the other officers found it hilarious when they could catch a short glimpse "on screen, [...] of a group of kids running away from a single zombie or a hoard of them. After receiving the principal's approval on the event, secretary, Sabrina Alayan "designed flyers immediately, and [the Fine Arts Club hung] them up" around the school, and promoted the event, said Hua. She mentioned that the planning process began two to three weeks prior to the event date. Hua described the planning process as "not difficult" given that "the whole officer team and club members [were] available to help as well."

Art teacher/FAC Advisor Joseph Luongo oversaw the popular event which drew about 50 players.

To All Malden High School Educators, Staff, Students and Administrators:

As we begin the first full week of November, here is some amazing news to share with all of you. The AP Capstone program was implemented in our school three years ago (this would be our fourth year), and have received the results of this past year's testing. The data I'm highlighting proves how

incredible our students and staff are at Malden High School.

100% of our AP Seminar students (20 students) passed with a 3, 4, or 5 (second year in a row).

-60% of those AP Seminar students received a 4 or 5. This is the highest percentage of any public school in Massachusetts with more than nine students taking the exam.

-100% of our AP Research students (10 students) passed with a 3, 4, 5 (up from 80% last year). We are the only public school in the state with more than 9 students taking the exam to have a 100% passing rate.

-Of public schools in the state, we had the most Research students receive a 4 or 5, including schools that had a larger number of students take the exam.

This is a reflection of the hard work and commitment of our students and staff. A huge thank you to the many staff members and community members who have helped students through mentoring, providing access to their classes for surveys and experiments, taking surveys or providing interviews, and in providing feedback as expert panel members.Well done!!






First Meeting for Malden HS Math Team is set for Thurs. Nov. 8







Malden High School students get in the mood for Election Day with spiffy political caricatures

Malden residents voting on Election Day will also have the opportunity to view formal portraits and caricatures of local, national and international political figures, including some of the current candidates, at Malden High School.

The Art, Politics and Immigration exhibit will be on display in the hallway adjacent to the main office of Malden High School and features approximately 50 pieces by MHS students, produced in the Studio 2 Honors classes taught by art teacher Joseph Luongo. This project is assigned every other year, during midterms and presidential elections. Students selected a photograph of a politician to draw in class, and then, closely observing proportions and values, penciled an accurate sketch. Once the drawings were completed, students then created a caricature, usually of the same person, in the medium of their choice.

Commenting on the selection process, Luongo said, "I allowed students to choose leaders from around the world as well as nationally recognized politicians. Some of the individuals are respected; others may have less than admirable qualities. Any editorial content that appears in the caricatures came from what students have seen on TV or have researched on their own."


