Playing against teams that are a lot more experienced and, simply, older in age, our Malden Tornados are a very young team. Their starters include members of all four of our classes. For instance, five Freshmen players started on Thanksgiving Day, including two on the offensive line. Six sophomores were also included in the starting lineup. It may have been the youngest team in Massachusetts that day. Oh, and it was just FOURTEEN DEGREES (14) at game time!! Springpoint is visiting MHS Tuesday on behalf of the Barr Foundation

We are one of five schools chosen for data analysis grant in Mass.

Mr. Mastrangelo writes:

Hello all,

I hope you all had a restful break. As we return to school we are embarking on a stretch of time that is difficult for many of our students. Please be cognizant of the fact that this time of year can trigger many of us. As always, we have supports for any students in need.

We are also embarking on a great opportunity with the Barr Foundation. In short, they will incorporate a multi faceted approach to analyzing all of our data. Malden High School is one of five schools in New England to have this opportunity (Hartford CT, Worcester, Portland ME, and Manchester NH). The team that we have assembled to work with the foundation has already had several meetings and spent the day with the other districts to have discussion and planning opportunities. On Tuesday, November 27 we have a group from Springpoint visiting the school. They will send a team of 4-6 people to look at our school in several different areas. It will be one day of

visiting classrooms, talking to student, staff, andsupport staff, and reviewing student work. The MHS team is meeting early Monday morning to discuss the staff panels, as well as the classroom visitation schedule. The impact to the staff is minimal. It is limited to a 30 minute panel discussion to staff that is selected, as well as 15-20 minute classroom visits to 12 different classes. We will be reaching out to staff for panel participation on Monday. I know the turnaround on this is quick but we did not select the visit date, it is chosen for us. Ours happen to be on the back end of the Thanksgiving break. Again, there will be minimal disruption to staff and students. When the group leaves us on Tuesday afternoon they will provide us with the results of their visit.

Our participation with this foundation will give a solid foundation of where we are and what steps we need to take to assure that our students and staff have access to the best possible education and resources. Thank you for your continued efforts to provide our students with the best education possible. *Cont. Next Page*

THANKSGIVING WIN RESONATES THOUGHOUT THE CITY on HOLIDAY!

MALDEN — In the teams' 131st meeting, Malden secured bragging rights for a year from rival Medford yesterday with a 28-24 victory at MacDonald Stadium. The Golden Tornados improve to 66-55-10 in the ancient series, which is the secondlongest in the country.

"It means everything. Ever since I started playing it's just been a great feeling. Even if you go 0-10, just beating Medford is the greatest of my life," said Malden senior receiver Raushad Moore.

Sophomore quarterback Justin Nortelus led the Golden Tornado offense, completing 7-of-16 passes for 148 yards and accounted for two touchdowns (one passing, one rushing). Mustangs quarterback Keith Barrasso rushed for

230 yards and three scores in the loss.

The game came down to a defensive stop by Malden (1-10) on its own 15-yard line with 1:08 to play. Freshman lineman Justin DeSimone recovered a fumble by Joel Disla, who had subbed in for an injured Barrasso. "This is a whole new season," Malden coach Steve Freker said of his team's first win of the year. "Thanksgiving's a whole new season. We prepared. We put some new wrinkles in. . . . I think it really paid off."

Malden jumped on top first. Justin
Nortelus found Matt Bessey for a 28yard pass to set up the Golden
Tornados with a first-and-goal at the
Medford 5. Running back Jerry Mervil
punched in the touchdown with a
rush on the next play to put Malden

up 8-0.

Medford (3-8) answered when Barrasso rushed for TDs on backto-back drives to generate a 14-8 lead. Malden didn't falter, however. After an Ishmael Sylus 51-yard reception, the Golden Tornados tied the game on an 11yard pass from Nortelus to Bessey.

At the start of the third quarter, Malden seized the lead as Nortelus found Mervil for a 35-yard touchdown connection. Nortelus would later add to the lead with a 6-yard TD run. Not to be outdone, Barrasso responded with a 4-yard score to cut the lead to 28-22 before DeSimone's fumble recovery sealed the deal for Malden.




