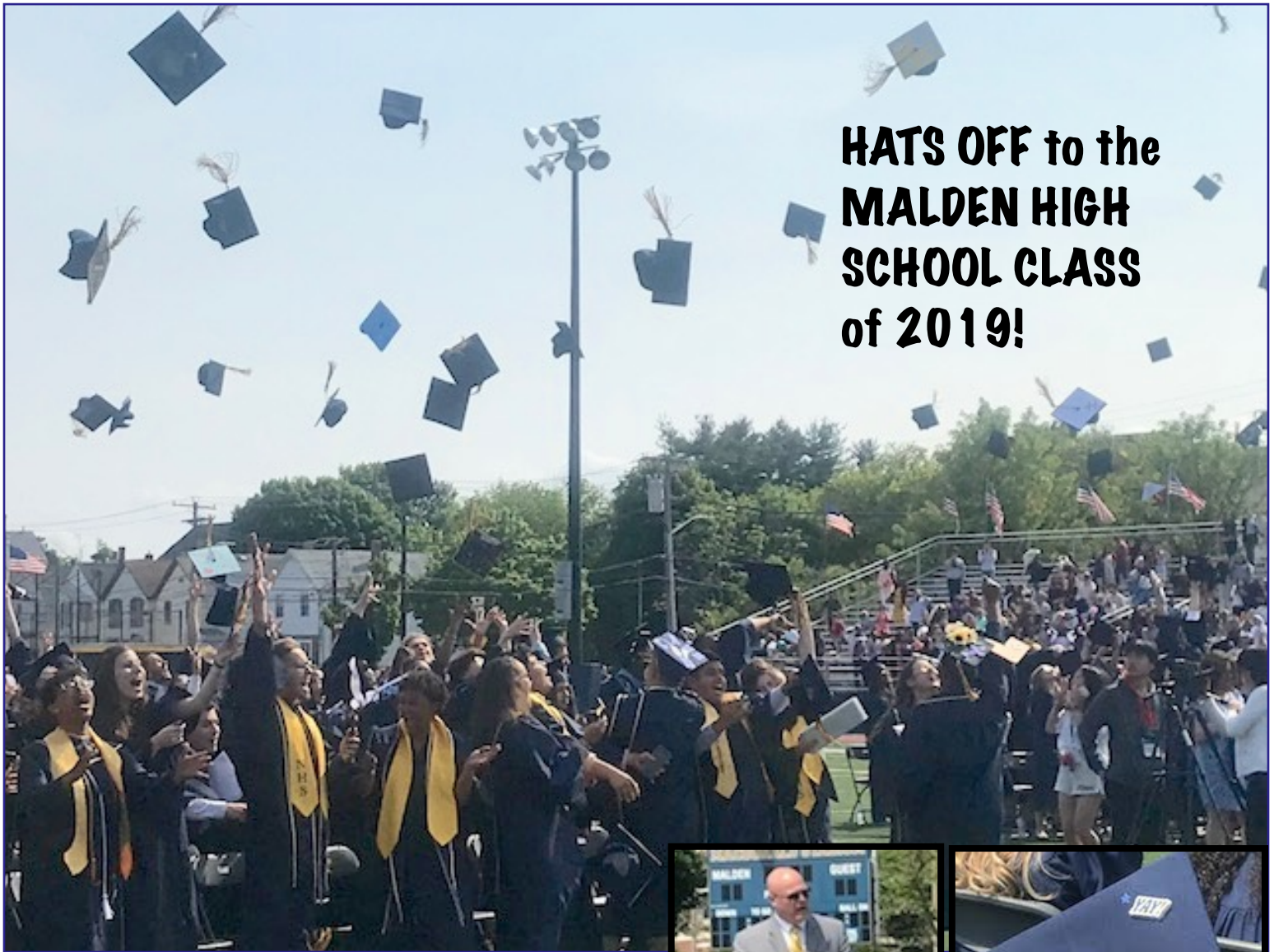

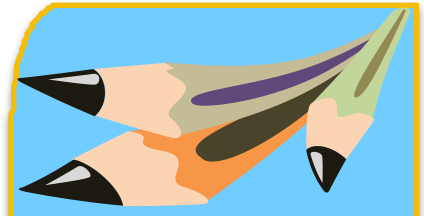


MHS Boys AND Girls Tennis made STATES in same year for 1st time ever for school

DID YOU KNOW?

That one of the most difficult wartime casualty rates for a single event has been the recently passed 75th Anniversary of D-Day. One of the reasons is that the U.S. military would not declare an enlisted soldier, sailor or airman dead until they had been missing a full year. Since many of those Allied troops killed in action on D-Day (est. at 4,414 from June 6-June 7, 1944) were at sea or in the air, it has been estimated at close to 7,000 is more accurate.

Malden High School APP SHOWCASE is a big success

Ms Horwitz and her students participated in the the Web and Mobile Application course at Malden High School which worked to engage students to develop real solutions to a problem that affects their local community. Students created a mobile app to address the problem they have identified. Working together, Malden High School teacher, Beth Horwitz and members of the MIT App Inventor team developed curriculum and resources to facilitate student learning and to evaluate students' changes in attitude, perception, and understanding towards coding to solve real world problems.



2018-2019 Apps that were developed this semester:

Financery—An app that records data on money spent and alert the users when too much money is spent.

Helpful-Trash Pickup— When the person has the app open, they take a picture of themselves picking up trash around the community and throwing it away. Every time they take a picture, they get a point. The player can look at a leaderboard to see where they place and who's in first.

Nite-Write— An app that allows users to log a nightly journal entry, track their mood, and help them sleep after submitting their entry.

Nutritional Food Value—The app gives nutritional information on food that people eat, or should eat.

Pothole App —An app that allows a user to report a pothole within Malden and to view nearby potholes in the city.

Schedule & Homework List— The app gives the school schedule and it has a button that counts down the time remaining in their classes, and it has another screen to list their homework.

Study Buddy— Study Buddy is an app that helps the user find people to study with based on what subject they need help on and it also records your daily homework.

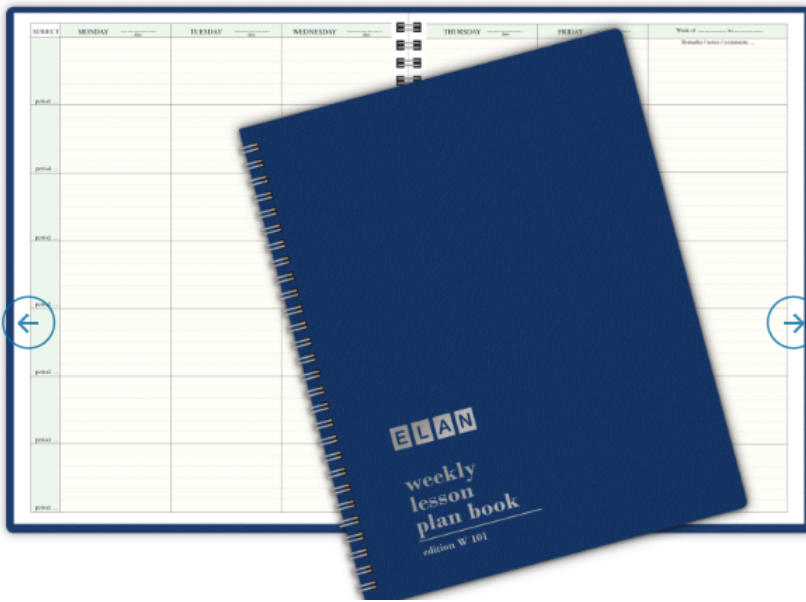
