## **Survey Background**

- The Malden Student Health Survey was conducted at the five Malden Middle Schools in May 2013.
  - Beebe, Ferryway, Forestdale, Linden, and Salemwood
- 1,127 students took the survey
- The survey asked about background characteristics including gender, age and grade level, as well as the following topics:
  - --Alcohol, Tobacco Marijuana and Other Drug Use
  - --Violence and Safety
  - --Mental Health
  - --Sexual Health
  - --Physical Health
  - --Protective Factors
- Data cleaning and analysis was conducted by the Institute for Community Health



## **YRBS** Validity

- "Research indicates data of this nature may be gathered as credibly from adolescents as from adults." - CDC
  - Numerous methods studies have been published on the topic and found selfreported behaviors from adolescents to be both valid and reliable (Brener et al, J Adolesc Health 2003)
- "To obtain truthful answers, students must perceive the survey as important and know procedures have been developed to protect their privacy and allow for anonymous participation." - CDC
  - Biggest threats to validity are students perceived lack of anonymity, social desirability bias, and attention seeking behavior
- "Internal reliability checks help identify the small percentage of students who falsify their answers." - CDC
  - Standard CDC data cleaning procedures were followed for the 2013 Malden Middle School Survey
  - Removed surveys with too few responses
  - Removed surveys if patterns in response detected (all yes, only the extremes, a b c d a b c d, etc)
  - Removed responses if logic checks failed




#### Trends in Lifetime\* Substance Use for Malden Middle School Students (2006, 2008, 2013)

#### Lifetime\* Substance Use for Malden Middle School Students, by Grade (2013)




#### Current\* Substance Use for Malden Middle School Students, by Grade (2013)


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#### Alcohol, Tobacco, and Marijuana Use for Malden Middle School Students (2013)




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


#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Were in a Physical Fight in the Past 12 Months, by Grade (2013)




#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Carried Weapons or Were in a Gang, by Grade (2013)




#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Bullying, by Grade (2013)



#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Bullying, by Gender (2013)




#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Sexual Harassment or Dating Violence, by Gender (2013)






#### Life Stress and Adult Support Among Malden Middle School Students, by Grade (2013)




#### Life Stress and Adult Support Among Malden Middle School Students, by Gender (2013)



#### Life Stress and Adult Support Among Malden Middle School <u>Girls</u>, by Grade (2013)




#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Depression\*, Self-Harm or Suicidality in the Past 12 Months, by Grade (2013)





#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Depression\*, Self-harm, or Suicidality in the Past 12 Months, by Gender (2013)





#### Trend in Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Experienced Suicidality\* (2006, 2008, 2013)






#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Have Ever Had Sexual Intercourse, Total and by Grade (2013)



#### Trend in Percent of Malden Middle School Students Who Have Ever Had Sexual Intercourse, Total and by Grade (2006, 2008, 2013)






#### Percent of Malden Middle School Students who Reported Physical Activity\* for 60+ Minutes Per Day in Past Week\*\* (2013)




\*Respondents were instructed to include "any kind of physical activity that increased your heart rate and made you breath hard some of the time"

#### Current Weight Control Goal Among Malden Middle School Students, Total and by Gender (2013)




#### Weight Status (BMI Percentile<sup>\*</sup> Category) for Malden Middle School Students, by Grade (2013)



\*BMI percentile was calculated based upon student's self-reported height, weight, and age



#### Prevalence of Healthy Habits Among Malden Middle School Students, by Grade (2013)



# Highlighted Areas of Concern



### Alcohol, Tobacco, Marijuana and Other Drugs

- Despite downward trends for most substances, rates of lifetime and current use for alcohol has remained steady since 2006
- Nearly half (47%) of 8<sup>th</sup> graders have tried alcohol and 14% have consumed in prior 3 months
- Girls are twice as likely to report current alcohol use, marijuana use, and inhalant use compared to boys

### Violence and Safety

- 28% of students experience bullying (either physical or cyber)
- Girls are more likely to experience bullying compared to boys (34% vs. 21%)

### Sexual Health

- Sharp downward trend in sexual intercourse since 2008 for all grades; by 8<sup>th</sup> grade, nearly 14% have had sexual intercourse
- Condom use is not universal (about 40% did not use at last intercourse); 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders in particular



### Mental Health

- Only half of 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders indicate they have an adult at school to talk to about problems
- Girls report higher stress than boys (63% vs. 39%) and worry more about appearance issues (57% vs. 28%)
- One quarter of students are depressed and approximately 12% express some form of suicidal thoughts or actions
- Girls appear particularly at risk for depression (35%), self-harm (20%) and suicidality (20% seriously considered) compared to boys

### Physical Health

- Less than one quarter of students are meeting the physical activity goal of 60+ minutes per day (less than half participate in sports teams)
- Nearly 60% of girls are actively trying to lose weight (20% of girls are using unhealthy methods)
- Approximately half of students (fewer among 8<sup>th</sup> graders) are engaging in healthy behaviors such as eating breakfast every day and sleeping at least 8 hours each school night
