Humanities:



• The Malden High School theatre program staged "Godspell" in the Jenkins Auditorium last month, and many schools featured winter concerts this December for chorus, band, and

music classes, K-12.

STEM:



• The MHS Science Department has been awarded roughly \$26,000 worth of

biotechnology equipment from the Mass Life Sciences Grant. Out of 105

schools, 49 were selected for this award.

Nursing and Health:



• The Nurses are continuously busy ensuring that we have a health record for every student and updating immunizations, physicals. We are starting mandating screenings (vision,

hearing, BMI) in some schools. The Nurses have been busy with students/staff who have GI/flu viruses. The Nurses are teaching/encouraging students to wash hands frequently and encouraging healthy habits.

• The Health teachers are encouraging Healthy habits, and are working with students on conflict resolution and bullying issues. They are also working with students on emotions.

Technology Integration:



- Elementary & Middle School students are learning how to code using MIT's Scratch program and many have participated in the Code.org "2016 Hour of Code".
- K-12 students are using BrainPop's online tools to create, construct, and collaborate as they learn and explore the world around us. Check out BrainPop, BrainPop Jr, and BrainPOP ESL with your students at home!

Athletics:



• The freshman duo of Nour and Batoul Chouiki have had an immediate impact on the girl's indoor track team. In addition to running impressive times in various events throughout the young season, the

twins ran big personal bests at the MSTCA Winter Festival Invitational in Boston. Their times of 1:47.42 and 1:47.93 rank 3rd and 4th among all freshman runners in the state of MA.

Physical Education:
