District Happenings

Superintendent's Entry Plan: Thank you to everyone who contributed to the survey you were sent in December. In the next few weeks, Superintendent Sippel will be hosting more town halls to follow up on ideas shared through the survey. ACCESS Testing: This month, English learners in all grades across the district are taking part in ACCESS Testing. This test is a state-required test, similar to MCAS, for English language learners. The test measures their academic English language skills. The results of this test allow us to provide the right level of English language support services to students going forward. Thank you to all our educators helping to proctor this test and thank you to all the parents and students arriving to school on-time and ready for testing.

Extracurriculars: In a collaborative effort with principals, the district is now offering afterschool clubs and activities for grades 6-8 at all of our K-8 schools. With a variety of options at each school, students can learn a new skill, follow a passion, and spend more time bonding with teachers and classmates. To learn how students can get involved in current programs, please contact your school principal.

MCAS and Question 2: There has been some understandable confusion around what the passing of Question 2 in the November election means for students and schools. Question 2 did not eliminate MCAS testing or make the tests less important. The only thing that changed is that MCAS performance cannot be used to determine if a student is eligible for graduation. Federal and state law still require schools to administer the MCAS test in grades 3-8 and once in high school, and students are still required to take the test. Additionally, MCAS is still used by the state to measure school and district performance. With its alignment to standards, MCAS continues to be an extremely important measure of students' achievement and readiness for the future. Malden will continue to prepare students to succeed on the MCAS tests this spring. Please encourage your child to do the very best on the MCAS assessments!
