Areas for Collective Action

- » Affirming **high expectations for all** students
- » **Adapting instruction** to meet diverse needs
- » Ensuring **fair access** to opportunities
- » **Partnering with families** effectively
- » Nurturing a **strong workforce**
- » Building district **strength and stability**

District Academic Priority

Priority: Ensuring that students are doing the “heavy lifting” in classrooms (*High Expectations for All*)

- In every classroom, during every lesson, all students will be:
 - visibly engaged
 - actively thinking
 - actively participating in discussion

Development Process (Malden Leadership Team)

- Use common observation tool to collaboratively analyze:
 - mid-year data from student assessments
 - formative classroom observations
 - identified trends from coaching and professional development

School Improvement Plans (SIP)

SIP Components

Areas for Collective Action

- Academic Priority → 1. High expectations for all
- Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) Priority → 2. Meeting diverse needs
- Scheduling Plan → 3. Fair access for all
- Attendance Priority → 4. Partnering with families
- Professional Development Calendar → 5. Nurturing a strong workforce
- Resource Allocation → 6. Strength and Stability

Next Steps

- Schools are finishing last steps and finalizing improvement plans throughout May
 - This involves feedback from students, staff, and School Site Councils
- Schools will bring final school improvement plans to the June School Committee meeting for review and approval
- Working towards a District Strategic Plan
