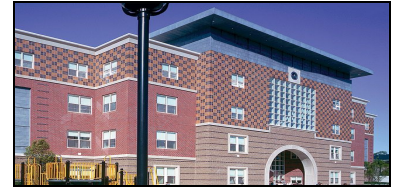

“The first book I am going to read is Dr. Seuss. Green Eggs and Ham.” - Ajami B.

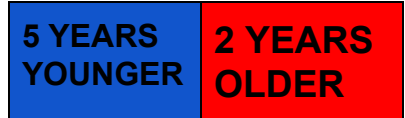

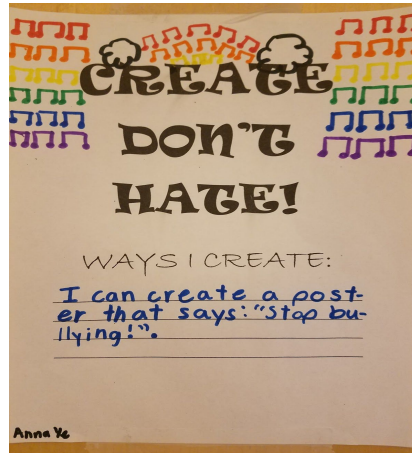
