## HEADS UP! SCAM WARNINGS



There are phony college scholarship services out there! Recently, the Federal Trade Commission found a number of websites with deceptive practices. Companies posing as scholarship search or financial aid foundations charge from about \$25 to provide you with list of scholarships. Some sites will charge up to \$800 to guarantee you a minimum amount of aid.

THESE PROMISES, LISTS AND GUARANTEES ARE NOT POSSIBLE. To identify false claims, consult [www.ftc.gov/scholarshipscams](http://www.ftc.gov/scholarshipscams). Beware of services that “do all the work for you.” **Students must apply themselves for scholarships and grants.** Never give out credit card or bank account info to “hold a scholarship.” Scholarship lists are available at schools, libraries and [www.fastweb.com](http://www.fastweb.com) and [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com).
