- *Two weeks ago, The Yale Exit Players visited Malden High Play Production for a session on Improvisation and Character Building.*
- *This past Wednesday Emerson Directing Professor Joe Antoun worked with a group of students on their self-scripting piece for METG drama festival.*
- *This week, 12 students from Play Pro will be involved in working with Boston University playwrights as a part of their ten minute play festival.*
- *Kamila Regalado was selected to represent Malden High in the English Speaking Union's Shakespeare Monologue Competition. She performed as Desdemona from Othello. She competes February 6th at Mount Ida College. Kudos to Sarah Bendell, Ali Fletcher and Brayan Angulo for their runner-up performances.*
- *Malden High School Play Production will perform at the preliminary round of the METG drama festival at Manchester Essex High School on February 27th at 9 a.m.. Their original show, All the King's Actors, tells the story of a theater group's production of Humpty Dumpty that takes a decidedly political turn after the election of an anti-theater demagogue. A production for the community is tentatively scheduled for February 24th at 6:30 in the Jenkins.*
- *Malden Play Production was also the recipient of the a \$2500 grant from the Malden Cultural Council for their Spring Production of Much Ado About Nothing, which - if all things go well - will be done in the Malden High School courtyard on May 26th and May 27th - Shakespeare in the Courtyard!*
