Malden Public Schools Grow Your Own Program



- Researched different models of Grow Your Own Programs, and other diversification models, by connecting with districts and organizations already using a GYO/diversification program.
- Explored ideas for college and university partnerships.
- Created a scope and sequence for a Grow Your Own course with possibilities for mentorship, internships, etc.
- Drafted a working mission statement.
- Curated resources including articles, videos, and survey results.



Teachers met during the Spring and Summer to create six robust curriculum units with accompanying lessons, materials, and products.

Units include:

- What is your educational experience? What is the purpose of education?
- □ What are the responsibilities of an educator?
- How do children/young adults grow and learn?
- What is good pedagogy?
- □ What is your view of education?



- Implement a 10 week Grow Your Own Pilot Program.
- Partner with a Consultant who has successfully run a GYO program in another district.
- Six Instructors rotating/co-teaching Wednesday afternoon sessions.
- Mass Hire has provided Seniors a paid opportunity to put into practice what they learn in GYO sessions to serve as paid education interns in K-8 classrooms and after school programs.

## Next Steps

- Gather consistent feedback from student participants
- Roll out MTEL prep courses to MPS staff members with support from GYO Instructors
- Create a sustainable model for a year long course/program

"I believe that it is important to have educators that reflect the student body. Growing up I have maybe encountered approximately 2 -3 teachers who looked like me, and to an extent it was isolating. I feel that this program could be key to introducing the field of education to students, especially in minority groups. In my personal experience I never really considered having a career in education as a result of the way that I was raised (either be a doctor or lawyer). Having this hands on experience available to other students can open a whole new world of opportunities and career paths. I would love to be apart of making this program a reality for future students!"
