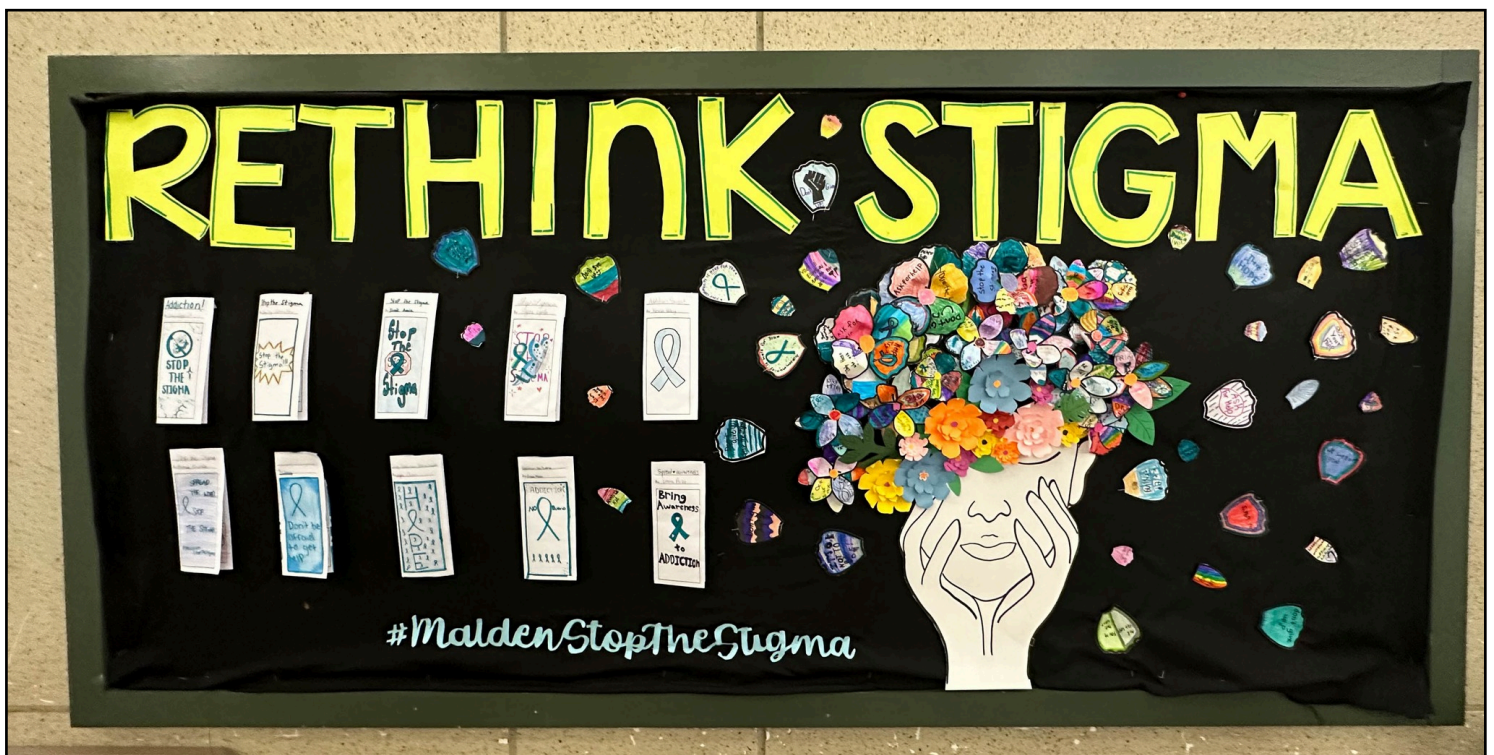

Model United Nations

Districtwide UN Simulation Debates Touch on Global Topics

A multi-week Model United Nations unit with simulations.

Malden Public Schools has partnered with the United Nations Association of Greater Boston who have created curriculum and facilitated the simulations. Students in 7th grade and 11th grade History classes worked as delegates to over 50 different countries tackling the issue of the need for Clean Water (7th) and Nuclear Proliferation (HS). Students researched the position their country would take on these issues, prepared a position paper to read in front of the delegation, and then worked with other delegates to form blocs in an attempt to create resolutions to these issues.

Malden Alerts (Malden's New Alert System)

Sign up to receive emergency alerts from the City of Malden. These may include information on winter weather, parking, traffic, roadwork, voting, public health and public safety.

Go to cityofmalden.org/MaldenAlerts, where you may choose which types of alert categories you want to receive and you can modify those selections at any time. You will also be able to put in your Malden street address to receive any alerts specific to that location such as roadwork, hydrant flushing, etc. Lastly, you may select to receive alerts in your native language.

We will send you alerts via email, text or voice call. Provide us with your most reliable contact information and also consider encouraging family members or roommates to do the same.

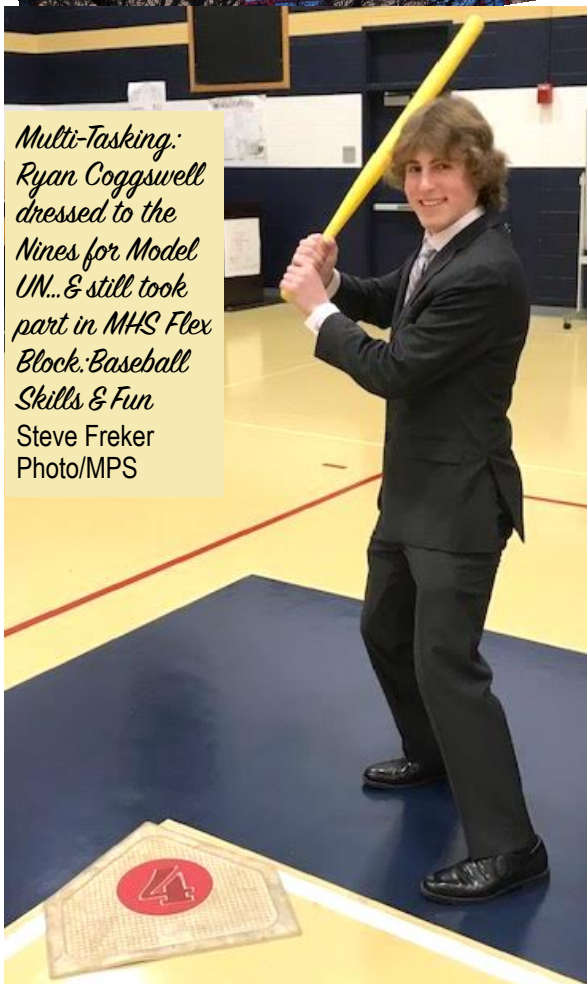

Get Boosted: Receive Free COVID-19 Vaccine and \$75 Gift Card

Each Member of Your Family Will Receive Card

State health officials are urging all Malden residents and those across the state to protect themselves and their family members from the COVID-19 virus with a series of nine, free Saturday vaccination clinics, conveniently located at the Mystic Valley YMCA, located at 99 Dartmouth St., Malden. (formerly the Malden YMCA)

As an added incentive, as part of the state's GET BOOSTED program, anyone who receives a COVID-19 vaccination dose at any of the Malden clinics will receive a free, \$75.00 gift card, which can be used at a local retailer. Customarily, one of the places the card can be used will be at a local grocery supermarket.

Each family member is eligible to receive a card. Also no ID or health insurance will be required to be shown at these free clinics under GET BOOSTED.

The Mass. Department of Health (DPH) is hosting the free vaccine clinics, which will be held from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. There are TWO free clinics remaining: On Saturday, March 18 and Saturday, March 25.

These are all walk-up clinics with no registration necessary. A similar series of free vaccination clinics was held this past fall in Malden, with hundreds participating. The clinics will offer first and second COVID-19 vaccine doses, as well as the updated bivalent COVID-19 booster. Massachusetts residents (adults or children) getting a COVID-19 vaccine (first dose, second dose, or booster) can receive a \$75 gift card at the participating clinics. All members of a family, including children, can receive gift cards. For children or teens under 18 years old, an accompanying adult



Free COVID-19 Vaccine will be administered and free Gift Cards distributed at the Mystic Valley YMCA, which is located 99 Dartmouth St., Malden (formerly the Malden YMCA).

must be present to receive the gift card(s). Anyone age 6 months and older can get a COVID-19 vaccination or updated booster at these clinics, unless otherwise noted in the clinic schedule below. According to information on the Mass. DPH website on the GET BOOSTED program, "Staying up to date on COVID-19 vaccines, including boosters, is the best way to prevent serious illness, hospitalization, and death from COVID-19. Boosters are an important defense, helping protect you against serious illness even if you've already had COVID.

"Being fully vaccinated and boosted can also help kids stay in school, help keep childcare programs open, and help prevent a family member needing to miss work to care for them," according to Mass, DPH.
