

Singing Her Praises

Linden Steam Academy Music Educator has uplifting story of her journey to the Malden Public Schools

Judith Albert says she had a passion for music and all that it offers for as long as she can remember.

A first-year Music Educator at Malden's Linden STEAM Academy, she is already passing along her zeal for the musical arts to her young students.

Albert also is ready, willing and able to "pay it forward" when it comes to instilling a love of music and sound to her Linden K-4 music students. She said she finds the Malden Public Schools a rich environment for teaching and learning.

"These students are so enthusiastic about music and I love working with them," Albert said, during an after school Music Club she was hosting at the school for students in grades Kindergarten to Grade 2.

The Linden Music Club also includes students in Grades 3 and 4, and the two groups change every Monday afternoon, for an hour-long session after school. When Albert was a student herself in the greater Miami, Fla. region, she fell in love with music as a young girl, in both performing on musical instruments— the piano in particular— and singing. She both played the piano and sang in her church, growing up, as well as performing informally Next Page

at other different venues.

The year before graduation, she got lucky, due to the kindness and ingenuity of a passionate music teacher with whom she was fortunate to take classes in her high school years. This was the same teacher, who "basically gave me all of my piano lessons for free. My family could not have afforded the going rate for lessons, and we were so blessed to have been treated so generously by Mr. Davis."

Albert said the Everglades High School teacher's largesse continued the summer before her senior year of high school. "My teacher loaded up a bunch of us who wanted to pursue music studies in college into a passenger van and we went on a tour of Florida colleges," Albert recalled. "We checked out many great colleges and had one goal in mind—to try and get a scholarship. Myself and others were successful and my college career began." It would not have happened at all without that first scholarship," said Albert, the daughter of immigrants to the U.S. and the first of her immediate family to have attended college.

Albert's studies took her from Palm Beach Atlantic University in West Palm Beach, Florida, on to Mercer University in Georgia and then, way up north for the first time in her life, to one of the most well-known schools in the world, the Boston Conservatory of Music, where she obtained a Master's Degree.

After a few years teaching music at two Massachusetts charter schools, grades 5-8 Pioneer Charter and grades 1-8 at Sacred Heart STEM School, Albert found her way to Malden, where she began teaching music to the youngest students at the Linden STEAM Academy at the start of this school year. So far, as the school year approaches the "home stretch," she told the Malden Advocate, "It's been wonderful!"

Recently, when the Linden administration, headed up by Principal Rafael Garcia, decided to ask the educators if any would like to host a club or other extracurricular activity after school, Albert said "I jumped at the chance." "I have gotten so much help and support in the years that I really needed it, I would really like to do the same for my own students," said Albert, who noted she is now working on her Doctorate of Musical Arts (DMA) degree. "This is the right place to do that, here in Malden."



CHA-run Malden Teen Health Center is now hosting Recovery Coach Program with Malden Overcoming Addiction group



The City of Malden is pleased to announce the Malden Teen Health Center (Center) at Malden High School which is run by Cambridge Health Alliance (CHA), has been hosting the Recovery Coach Program on site every Thursday from 11 AM-12 noon. Located at Malden High School, the Center offers primary care services from physicals to immunizations, mental health care from evaluations to support, as well as sexual and reproductive care education to Malden youth from 12-24 years of age. Malden Recovery coaches Paul Hammersley and PJ Bell will run the effort and they have many years of experience promoting recovery to those seeking or already in recovery from drug and/or substance abuse. Malden Alerts (Malden's New Alert System)

Sign up to receive emergency alerts from the City of Malden. These may include information on winter weather, parking, traffic, roadwork, voting, public health and public safety.

Go to <u>cityofmalden.org/MaldenAlerts</u>, where you you may choose which types of alert categories you want to receive and you can modify those selections at any time. You will also be able to put in your Malden street address to receive any alerts specific to that location such as roadwork, hydrant flushing, etc. Lastly, you may select to receive alerts in your native language.

We will send you alerts via email, text or voice call. Provide us with your most reliable contact information and also consider encouraging family members or roommates to do the same.

ATTENTION MALDEN RESIDENTS PROTECT YOUR BICYCLE



The Malden Police Department needs help from the Community to combat bicycle thefts. The Police Department would like to work with the community to recover stolen Bicycles. By documenting and retaining the serial number to your bicycle, you can provide valuable information to the Police. This enables Police Officers to be able to identify stolen bicycles when they are in possession of a person who is not the rightful owner.

- Invest in a quality bike lock. preferably a U-Lock. You should safeguard your bicycle when unattended by using a heavy-duty locking device and securing your bicycle through both wheels and around the frame to an immovable object. Cables and chains are easily defeated.
- Keep a record: Record Serial Number- make, model, color. Engrave your name on the bicycle. Take photos of your bike and the serial number
- · Park at a bicycle rack if possible well-lit area


