### 1. Roll Call

### 2. Health

- Due to the updated state guidelines for health standards the council is concerned that our current curriculum has not been updated in quite a while.
- The assistant superintendent informed the council that there is a plan in place to review our current curriculum in light of the new Frameworks for alignment.
- If the curriculum is found in need of being replaced, then the panel will consider ideas on how to have family and Community input.
- In most cases several curriculums are reviewed and often piloted to see which is the best fit for our needs.
- The council asked what the timeline looked like for this process. Assistant superintendent said they will move as fast as they can and as slow as they must. The assistant superintendent said that the curriculum review portion of the process should be completed by the start of the new year.

### 3. Band & Spanish

- The council expressed appreciation for the addition of the after-school band for students in the Middle School.
- The site Council expressed concern over the posting being just for Spanish when they had specifically asked for a multicultural position being posted to cast a wider net. The assistant superintendent suggested that perhaps that might

be where strategic planning could come into play. The superintendent is working on developing a strategic plan as part of his entry plan. The Strategic plan is a 5-year plan that takes into account where we want to go as a district. The Strategic plan is what drives the budget and positions.

#### 4. Discipline Data

- In reviewing the discipline data there has been a marked decrease in the number of office referrals. This is attributed to having a more comprehensive restorative practice policy in place.
